


Participate to "VIOEDU Arena"

This is a highly competitive arena, candidates are ranked directly according to the time spent on the test and the score achieved. The competition encourages candidates to practice thinking, not only to compete but to help students self-study, consolidate knowledge and improve problem-solving skills.

VioEdu Arena has become a familiar playground where SVIS@NT students can "learn while playing - play while learning", and at the same time develop confidence when competing with friends from all over the country.
