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HOW TO PRACTICE ENGLISH DURING SUMMER VACATION

The end of the school year at SVIS is getting closer so some students (or parents) might wonder how to maintain or even improve their English or other skills during the summer break. It is a good idea to plan to do something every day so here are a couple of suggestions:





Many centers provide summer classes for both primary and secondary students. But how to pick the best one?

- Consider your child's interests and hobbies. The first step in choosing the right summer camp for your child is to ask about what they would like to do. Some summer camps have themes (beach holiday, explorers, space etc.). Try to find a program that piques your child's interest.
- Research camps. Try to find out as much information as you can (what books do they use, who are the teachers, how many students are in a class.) Find out camps

that offer activities your child is interested in and then look for the budget.

- Check safety measures.

Summer classes are a good and interactive way for your child to keep and learning and they even have opportunities to make friends.

2. Movies with CC:



Another excellent way to expand your vocabulary is to watch movies in CC mode. "CC" stands for "closed captioning," which means English subtitles appear at the bottom of the screen. Closed captioning allows you to read every word the actors speak while listening to them say it. When watching a movie or a video on YouTube or Netflix, look for "CC" in a box at the bottom of the screen. This is a wonderful method for understanding and identifying each word, as well as seeing the spelling and hearing the right pronunciation. You might want to pause and practice saying new words.

2. Reading stories:

One last suggestion is reading books. Take your child to a library to get them excited about books or find a website that has free reading materials. Encourage them to read a little every day. Try to find a topic the student is interested in. It is also a good idea to have a small project after reading the story such as drawing a picture related to the story, act out a certain scene or make a collage or scrapbook. Reading will help the kids with their pronunciation, spelling and a grammar as well.
